Project in the framework of the Europe for Citizens programme.

Questionnaire report

Vote4Europe project - developed under the Europe for citizens programme - aims to encourage low qualified young people and adults (16-35 years old) to participate to the European debate by allowing them to become informed European citizens and to encourage them to vote for the European Elections during the 23rd and the 26th May 2019.

In order to reach the project objectives, the partnerships developed a questionnaire to be disseminated to youngsters aged between 18 and 35 years old. The idea was to gather their point of view and knowledge regarding the European Institution as European Parliament.

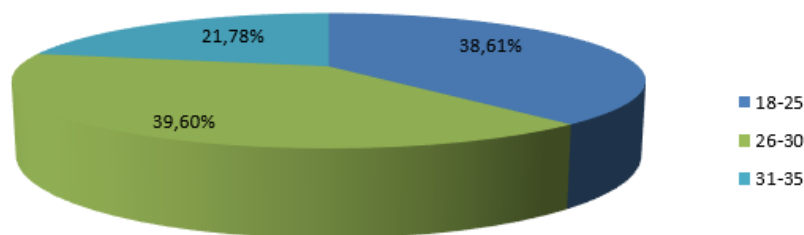

In total, 102 young people participated to the questionnaire, 38 men (37.62%) and 63 women (62.38%).

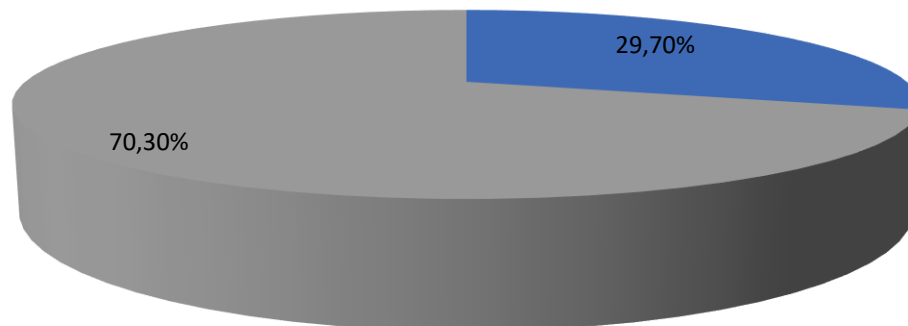
We disseminated the questionnaire, we ensured that the participants would be aged between 18 and 35 years old. In total, 38.61% were aged between 18 and 25 years old, 39.60% were aged between 26 and 30 years old and 21.78% were aged between 31 and 35 years old. (See graphic below)

Regarding the place of residence, 70.30% declared that they were living in an urban area whereas 29.70% declared that they were living in a rural area.

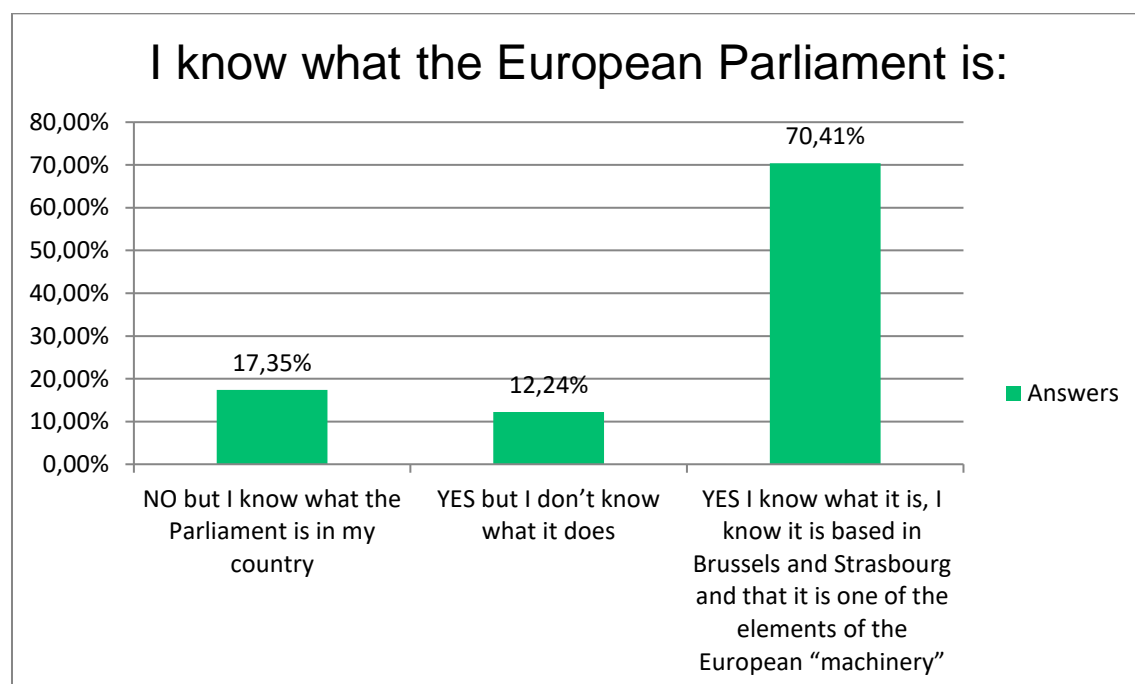
My place of residence (in the EU):



All participants declared being **French citizen** and 3 people skipped the question.

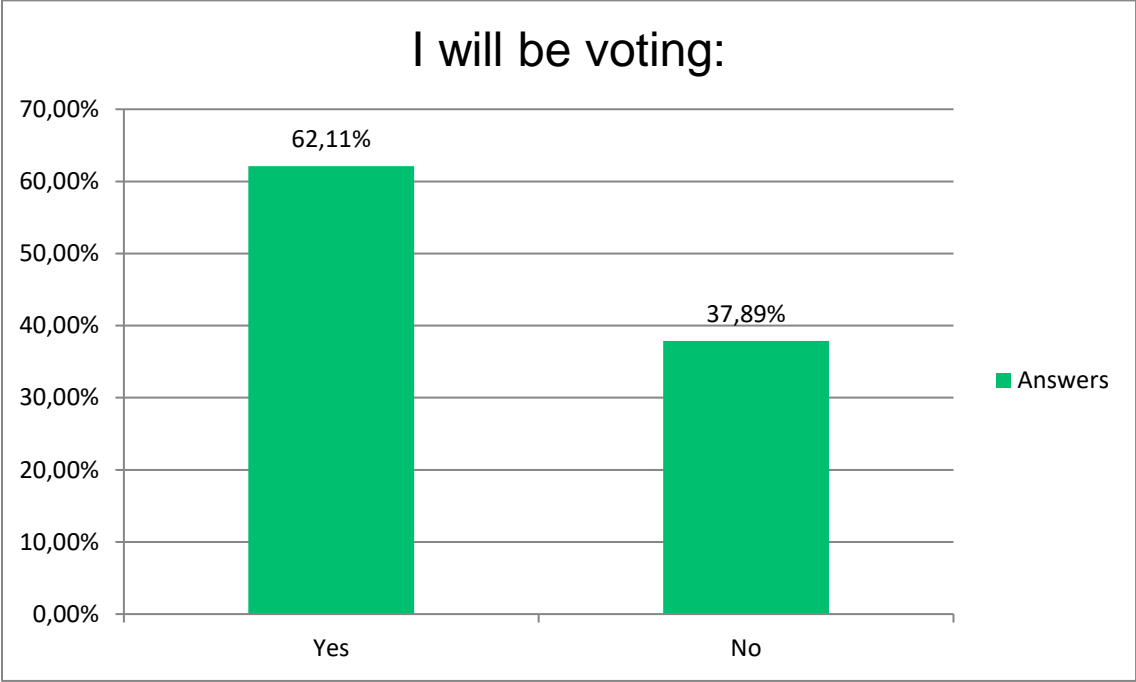
I/ First axis: Vote for the European Parliament? What is that?

Regarding the question to know how much they know about the EU, the results are as follow: 17,35 % answered “NO but I know what the Parliament is in my country”, 12,24% answered “YES but I don’t know what it does” and 70.41% answered “YES I know what it is, I know it is based in Brussels and Strasbourg and that it is one of the elements of the European “machinery”. 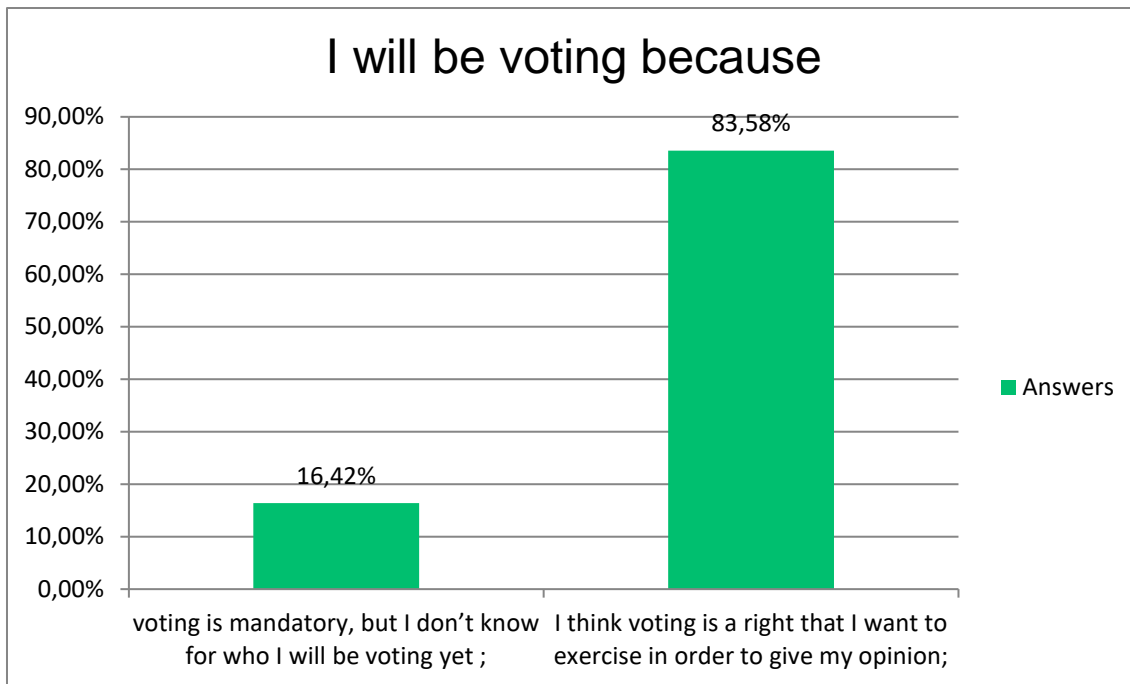


II/ Second axis: the administrative procedure and making an effort to go to vote in May 2019

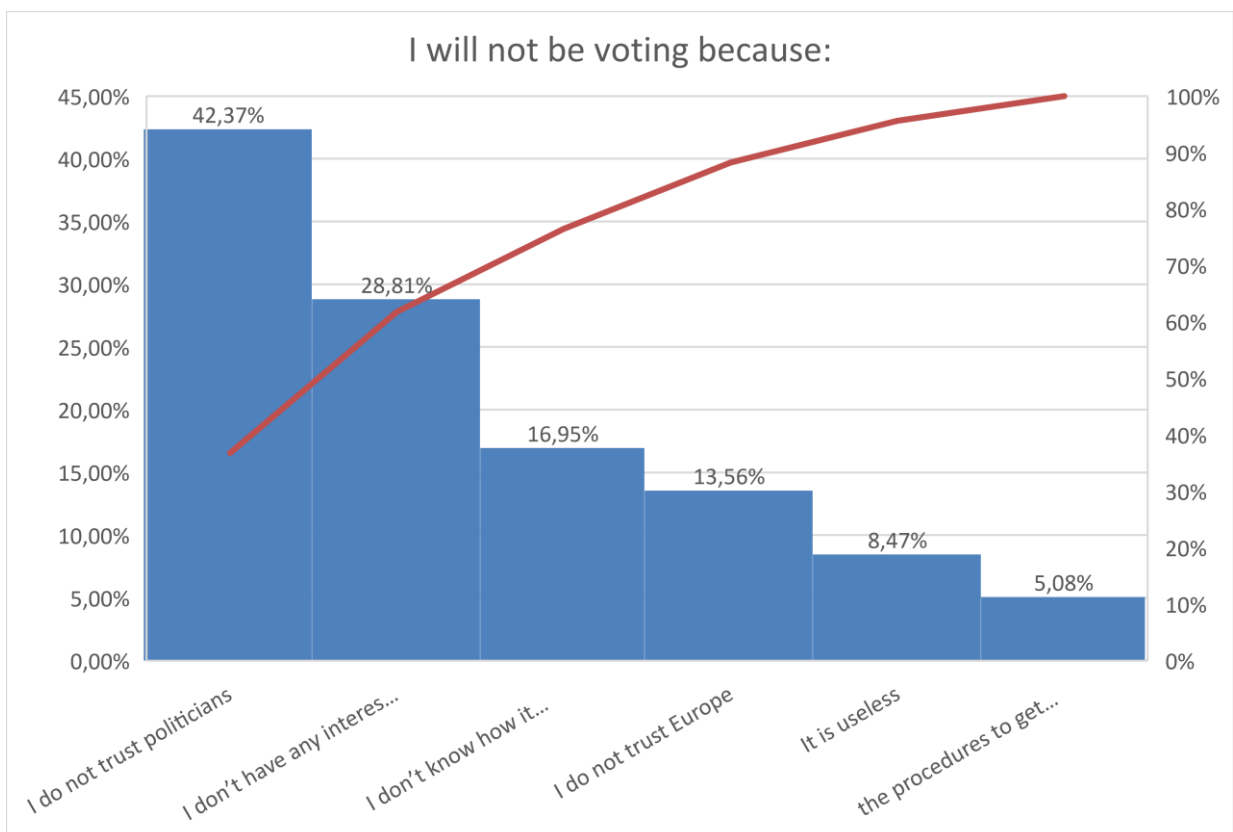
Regarding the question to ask if they will go to vote, 62.11% answered yes and 37.89% answered no.



People who answered "yes" to the previous question had the opportunity to go a little bit further and to answer to the question "I will be voting because". 16.42% answered that voting is mandatory, but I don't know for who I will be voting yet and 83.58% answered that they think that voting is a right that they want to exercise in order to give their opinion.

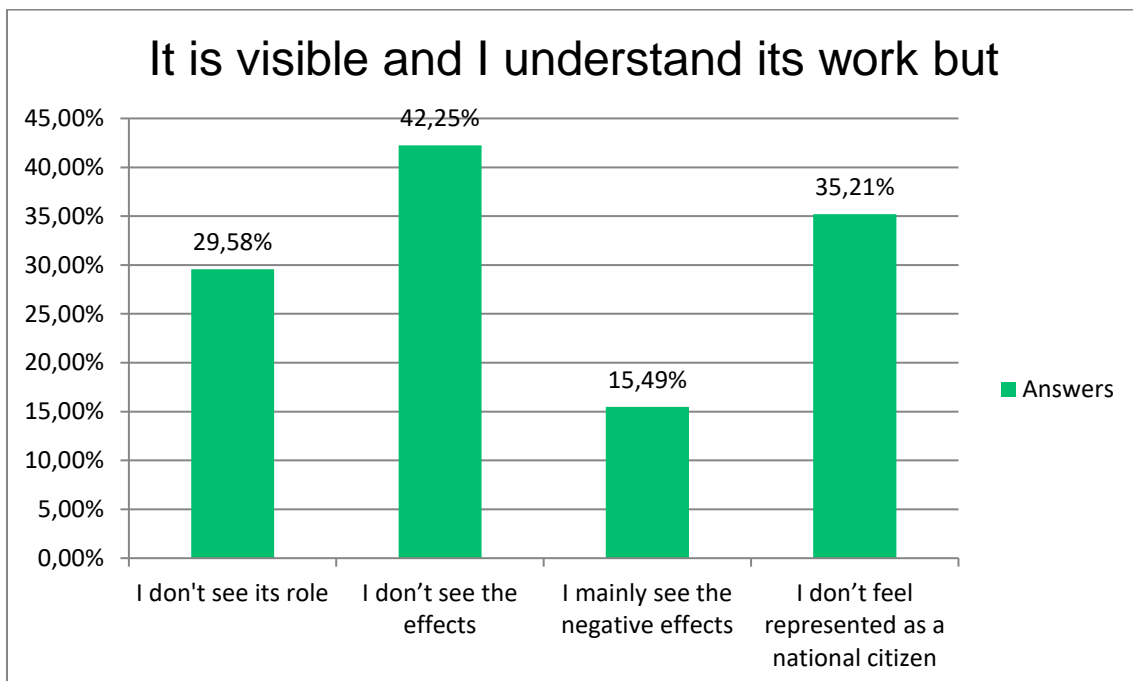
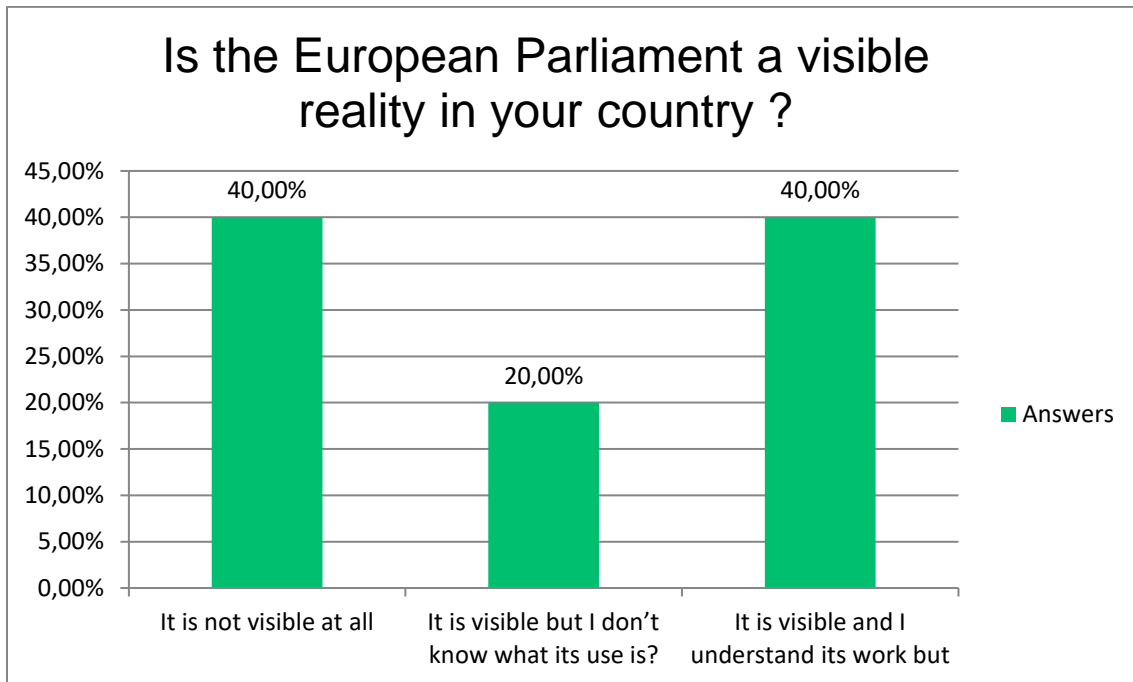


People who answered no to the question “I will be voting” had the opportunity to answer the following question: “I will not be voting because”. A majority of the respondent answered that they do not trust politicians (42.37%). 28.81% answered that they don't have any interest in this and they do not feel concerned; 16.95% answered that they don't know how it works; 13.56% answered that they will not be voting because they don't trust Europe, 8.47% answered that it is useless and 5.08% answered the procedures to get registered as a voter are administratively too complicated.



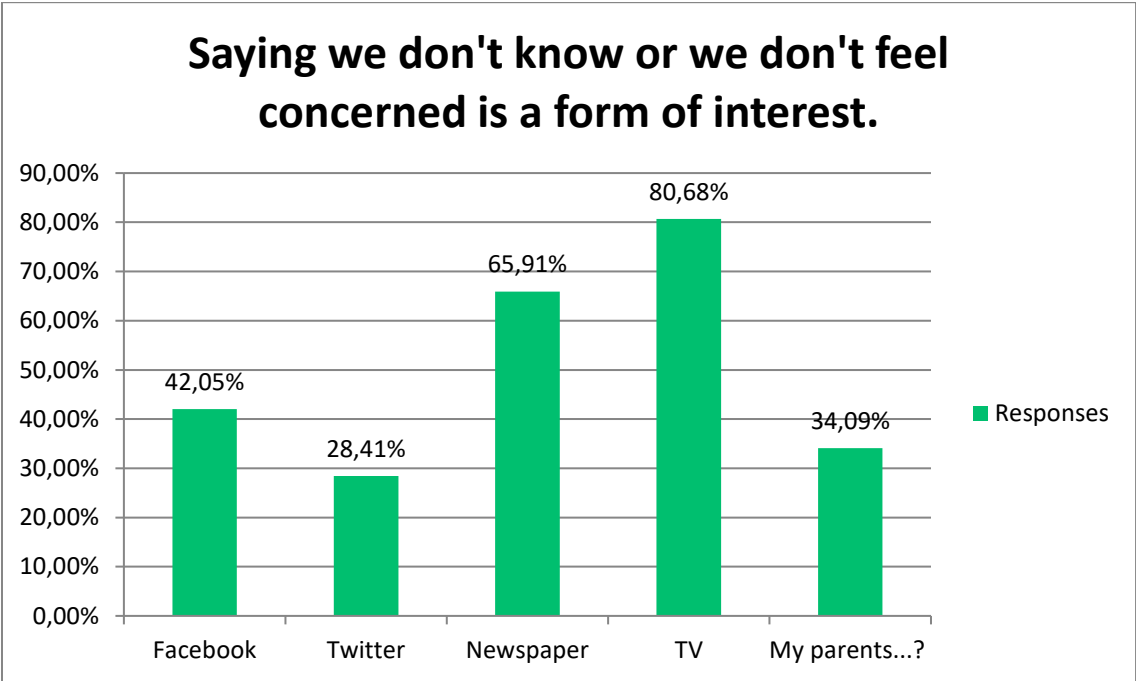
III/ Third axis: the European Parliament.

Regarding the question to know if the European Parliament a visible reality in their country, 40% answered that it is not visible at all, 20% answered that it is visible, but they don't know what its use is and 40% answered the third option.



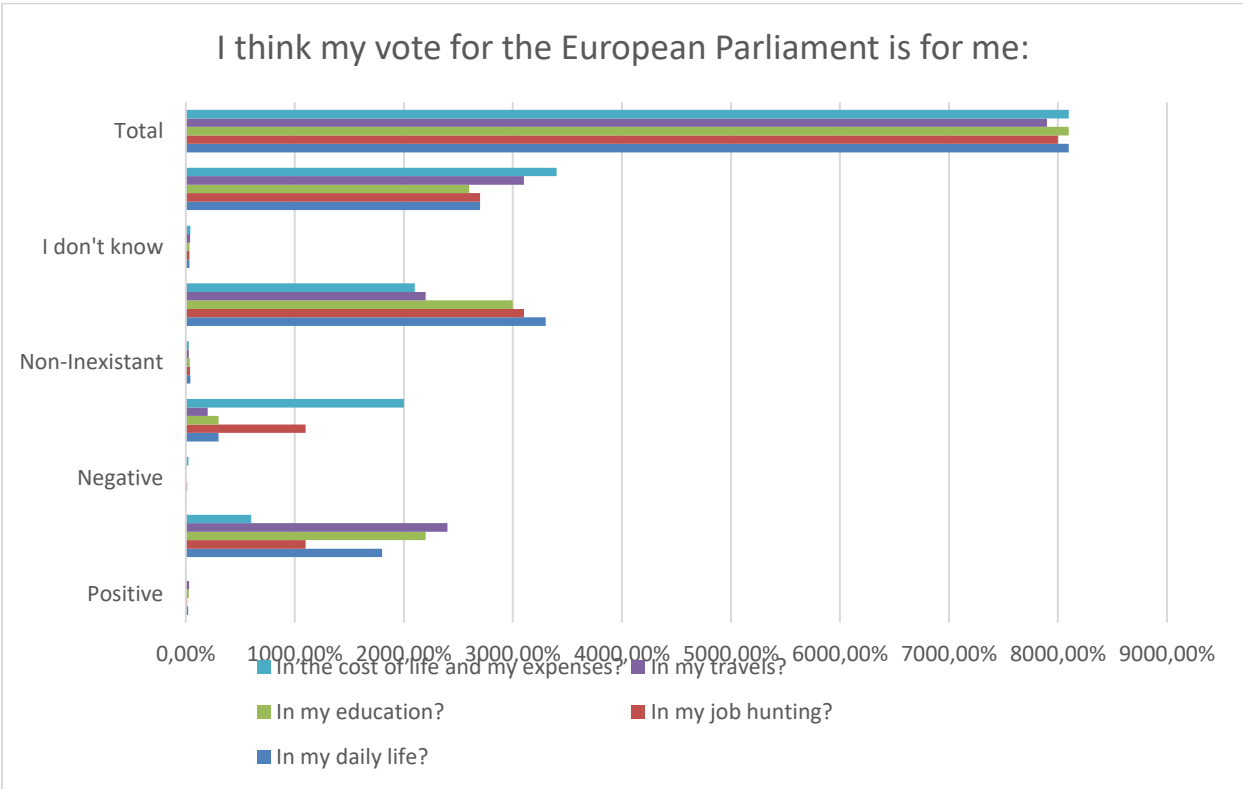
Regarding the question : “saying we don't know or we don't feel concerned is a form of interest. How does one get information on the European institutions even if it's randomly?”,

42.05% answered Facebook, 28.41% answered Twitter, 65.91% answered newspapers, 80.68 answered TV and 34.09% answered my family.

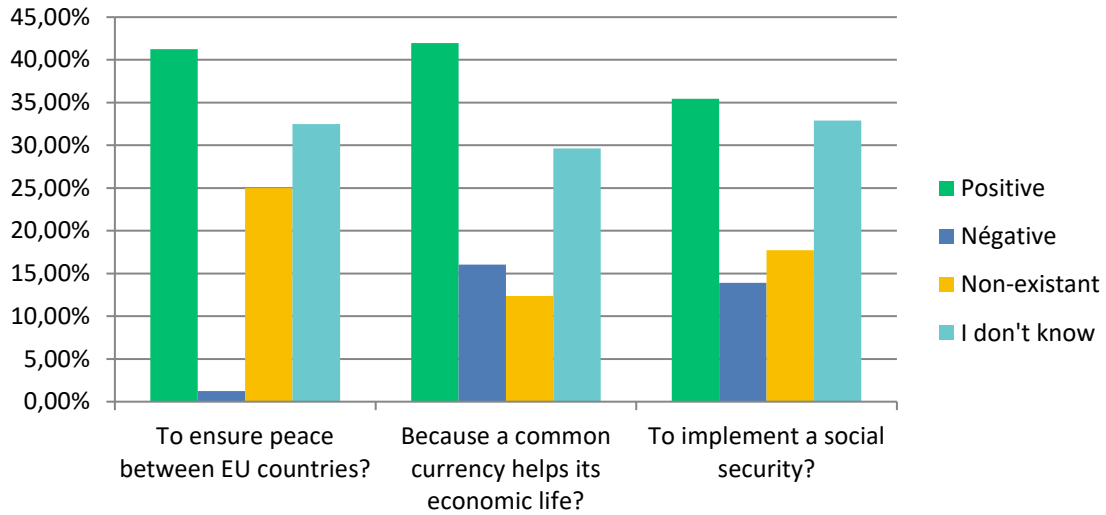


IV/ Fourth axis: The impact of my vote for the European Parliament based on what I think:

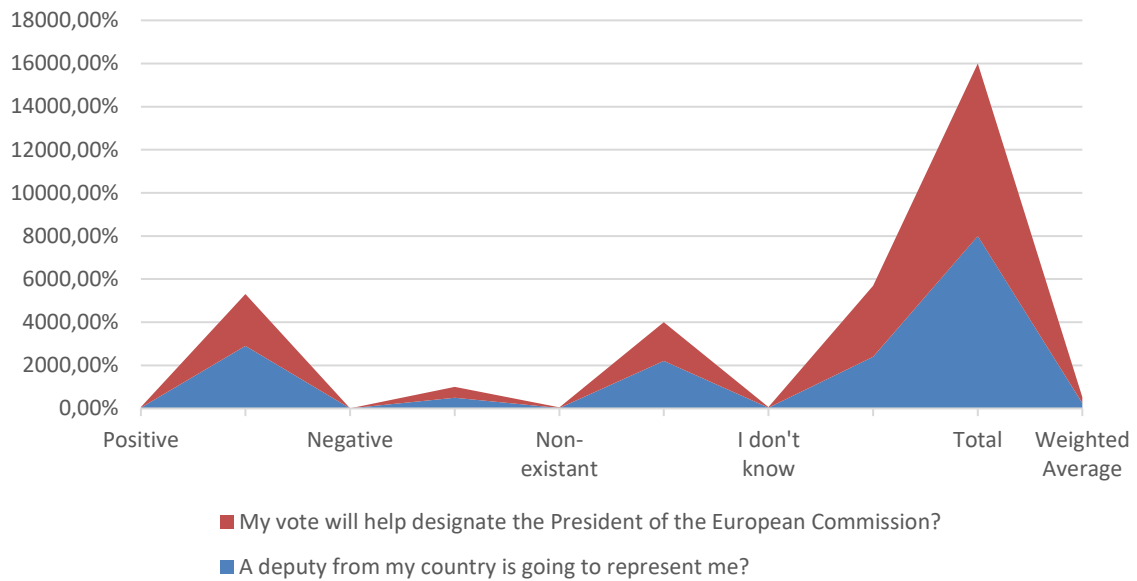

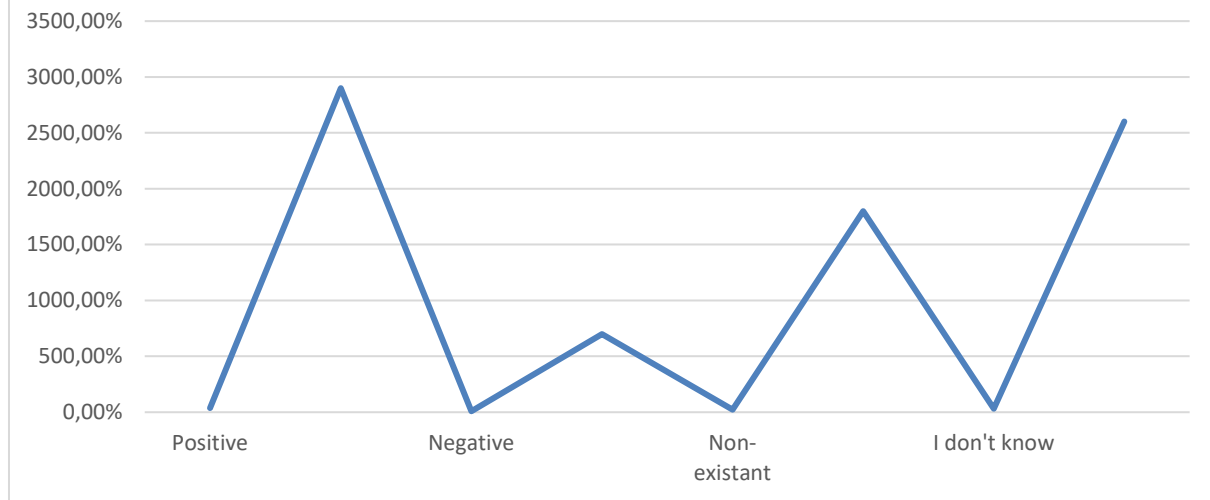
I think my vote for the European Parliament is for my country



I think my vote for the European Parliament is for the EU



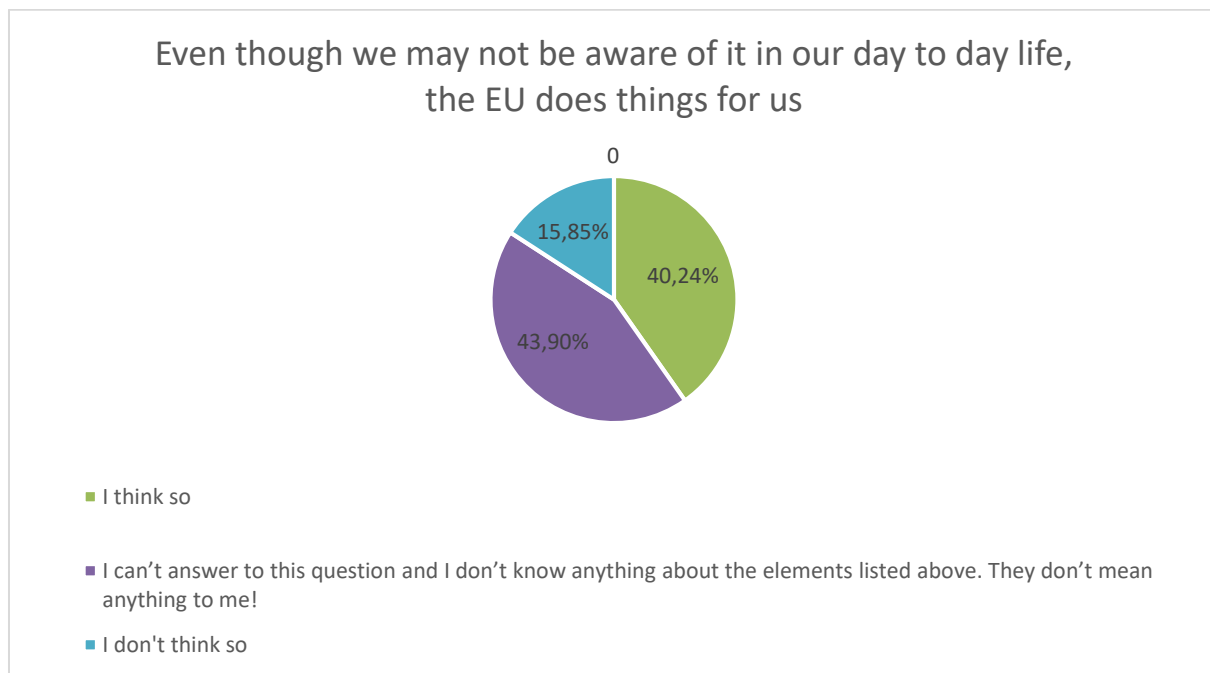
The EU is going to influence the United States, China and Russia in order to uphold the European interests in crucial matters as environment, terrorism, migrations...?



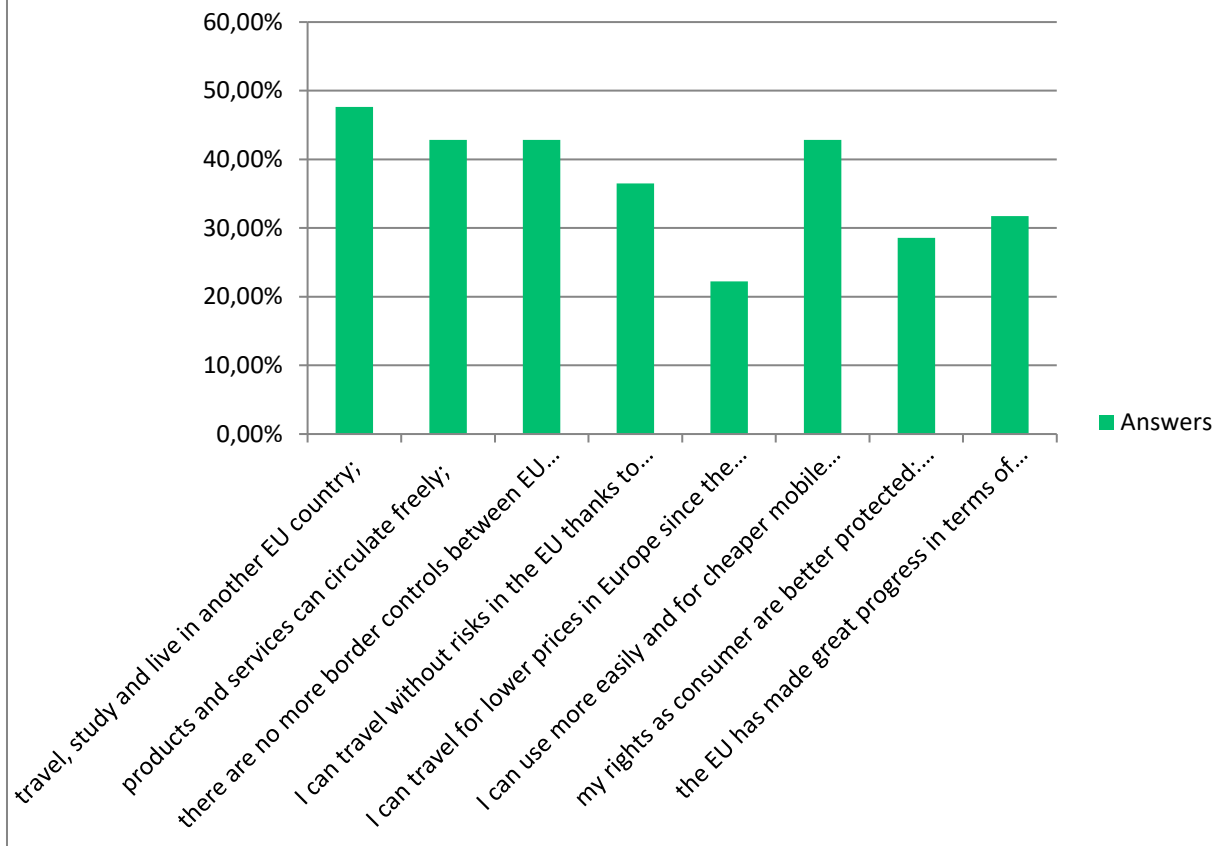
V/ Fifth axis: Even though we may not be aware of it in our day to day life, the European Union does things for us:

Even though we may not be aware of it in our day to day life, the EU does things for us

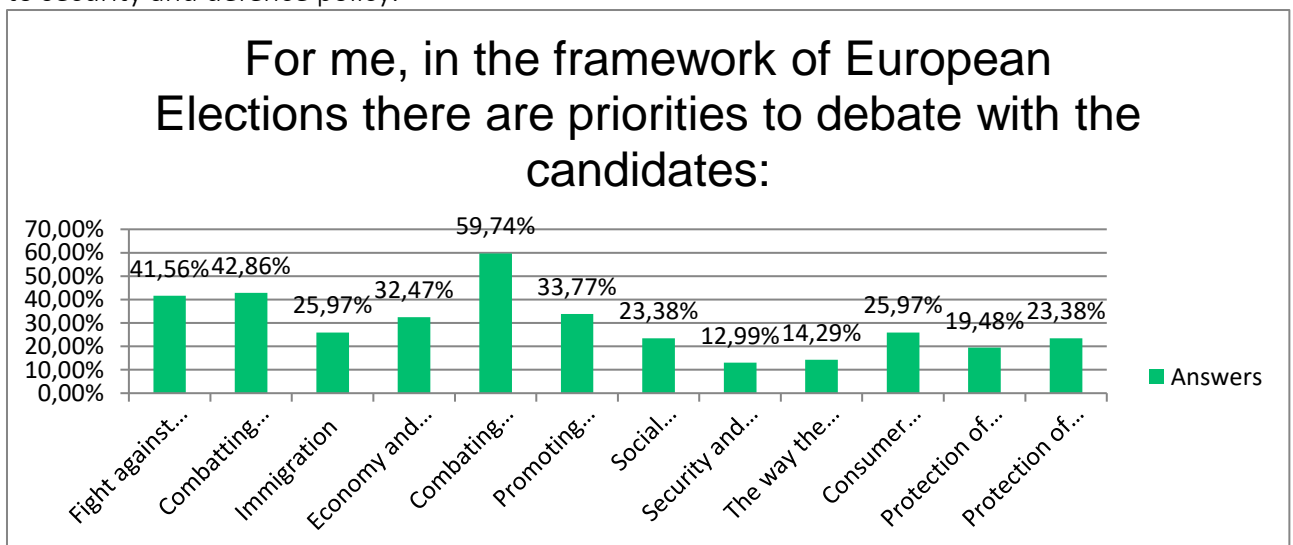

VI/ Sixth axis: for me, in the framework of European Elections there are priorities to debate with the candidates:

Regarding the priorities to debate, most respondents (59.74%) answered that combating climate change and protecting the environment is the priority. Fight against terrorism and combatting youth unemployment reached more than 40% of the answers. The lower rate refers to security and defence policy.



Based on those priorities, write one question that you will ask to a national candidate to the European Elections and for which we could require him/her to commit effectively.

- Do you think that Brexit will have important consequences for the balance of the European Union?
- Why not trying to be more visible to the public? How can we explain that we are not aware of your existence or what you really do regarding EU citizens?
- Will you really commit yourself to sanction EU members and other countries all around the world to work to help save the environment and our planet?
- What would be the concrete methods to fight against unemployment?
- Would you really commit to fight against global warming, plastic waste, improve recycling techniques, stop nuclear power?
- Would you commit yourself to an ecological and social policy?
- Could you support a common commitment among EU countries to take strong measures to fight against climate changes?
- Do you think yellow jackets will win?
- What is your opinion regarding the issue of the stateless nations and the historic nations of the EU not recognized by this institution whose fundamental rights are violated by member states? To what extent are you in favour of the Europe of Regions instead of the Europe of States?
- Would you commit yourself regarding the protection of the environment?
- How would you fight against youth unemployment?
- What do you envisage regarding global warming issues? When will we have a Parliament that demands a standardization of taxation, standard of living, protection of our environment? When we really realize that a good quality of life depends on our environment and the efforts today are minimal compared to the challenge. Why not giving the opportunity to all European citizens to vote for certain problems without going through deputies who do not represent us all and who gives priority to their personal interests?
- Are you going to change something? Why you?
- How can the EU help with climate changes when the member states do not respect anything and drive us to disaster?
- When will nuclear power be abandoned in favour of other methods of production?
- Given the fact that the various international meetings, congresses and commitments taken by the EU to the fight against climate change and global warming is absolutely not honored and efficient, how can the EU do something about it? we no longer can be put this issue on the side?
- What are you going to do regarding the environment and the junk food issues?
- How to better guarantee access to employment for young graduated people?
- After years of creating food standards that will benefit to the industrialists, do you know when a real campaign to promote the small organic producers and to stop these nonsenses exchanges will be initiated?
- Can you help make Europe's action more visible in everyday life?
- Several questions about intensive farming, animal causes, ecology and public health
- When do you plan to take the environmental issue seriously by reducing air, water and land pollution (get rid of plastic waste, pesticides and imposing a strict regime on the most polluting firms)?
- How to make the European institutions more democratic?

- Are you going to force the European countries to give up nuclear power and to commit on a responsible and reasoned energy transition?
- When do you intend to do something for our planet?
- It is useless to ask him a question, you must ask several questions and see his reaction in live, because if the questions are programmed, the answers are programmed.
- Are you going to consider the negative changes of our environment, too many and very high taxes and a real protection of animals and their living conditions? (There are thousands of things to fix and we need strong and visible actions)
- When is a real European economic, environmental and military policy?
- We are currently witnessing an ideological clash between pro and anti-immigration, meanwhile, the number of migrants is increasing, some are suffering, terrorists can go through the borders between Eu countries and the local population is completely disoriented and overwhelmed. What do you intend to do to finally consider this problem pragmatically and propose a solution that will take into account both the human and vital aspects and also the need to limit migration flows? risks of terrorism?
- Knowing that the price of life is not more expensive for you than for us and that the SMIC is 1 149 € net. Would you be willing to review your wages of € 6,200 (you politicians), and pay for environmental protection?
- How will you accelerate the ecological transition in the 3 axes of sustainable development?
- How is the European union doing to fight against cyber-harassment
- What does it means to fight against terrorism?
- Are you ready to be accountable to your constituents?
- How to solve the problem of immigration?
- When will you give us the same purchasing power as with the francs?
- What do you plan to do to fight against global warming?
- Do you think you can keep your words to your actions after the elections?
- In a context of globalization how to take into account the specificities of the regions (language, culture ..)?
- How do you plan to act to fight against climate changes?
